We will be voting on 2 constitutional amendments, 2 statewide referendums, and 2 special election questions, one of which is TSPLOST. Interesting fact from Heritage Foundation News: Question....*Do the rich "pay their fair share" of taxes?* Answer....The top 10 percent of income earners paid 71 percent of all federal income taxes in 2018 while taking home 48 percent of all income. Contrast that with the fact that, in the same year, the bottom 50 percent of earners paid 3 percent of the tax burden on 12 percent of total income, and I think you'll find that the top earners are paying more than their fair share.
